

## New TTOS Grading Standards

At the August 14, 2008 board meeting, the Board of Directors of the Toy Train Operating Society decided to return to our previous grading standards by TTOS members when offering trains for sale or trade. Effective immediately, please start using these grading standards:

MINT - Brand new, absolutely unmarred, all original and unused.

**LIKE NEW** (LN) - Free of any blemishes, nicks or scratches, original condition throughout, very little sign of use.

**EXCELLENT** (EX) - Minute nicks or scratches, no dents or rust.

**VERY GOOD** (VG) - Few scratches, exceptionally clean, no dents or rust.

GOOD (GD) - Scratches, small dents, dirty.

FAIR - Well-scratched, chipped, dented, rusted, or warped.

**POOR** - Beat up, junk condition, some usable parts.

All description standards are mainly in regard to condition of finish. This should be kept constantly in mind. In all categores except Mint or Like New, parts can and may be missing. Any such missing parts must be noted when describing the piece. Also, any replacement parts must be noted, or exceptions to the stated category. All restored or refinished items are to be so stated. Note that the standards apply to original items. No grade above Excellent can apply to a refinished piece. We do not here recognize in-between or multiple grades, such as Excellent plus, Excellent minus or Very Good to Excellent.



### Trip to TCA York Meet Cut Short

This year when I had the opportunity to join Hollis Cotton, Jim Seels, and Fritz Von Tagen at the Pre-York Meet sales, I said yes since I had never gone early. Looking forward to a full week at York, my wife Phyllis drove me to LAX on Sunday for my Southwest 6:45 a.m. flight to Baltimore. As we drove, listening to KNX, we were aware a fire in Kagel Canyon was spreading to Lopez Canyon and smelled the smoke at LAX.

Fritz met me at the airport in a rented Chrysler Town & Country and a half hour later we picked up Hollis and Jim at the United Terminal and headed for York. After checking in at our motel, we visited Billy Bob, and after dinner I called Phyllis and found out our son, Ron, daughter-in-law and grandson had been evacuated from their mobile home park at the mouth of Lopez Canyon, and were in a Sylmar motel since the fire department anticipated evacuees returning to their homes Monday morning.

Monday morning in York, after an early breakfast we headed to the Hollydome where sellers were setting up in the parking lot and spent most of the day checking items out. When I called Phyllis Monday evening, I learned that heavy winds fanned the fire at 4 a.m. and the fire storm roared into the mobile home park resulting in a large number of homes lost. Monday evening our son, daughter-in-law, grandson and a bunch of their cats which they had rounded up when they were evacuated on Sunday were at our home.

I then told Hollis, Jim and Fritz that I needed to get home ASAP to help my family. Tuesday morning Fritz and I discovered car rentals do not rent one way. So Fritz took upon himself to drive me down to the BWI airport, giving up 2 hours plus of trtading. Thank you, Fritz!!

Southwest Airlines was terrific. They got me on an afternoon flight when I called them late Monday. At the airport I discovered an even earlier afternoon flight to LAX, and Southwest was able to work out connections by 10 minutes of boarding time. I arrived back home by 7 p.m.


Our son's mobile home is a total loss. See the picture in the right column. Word to the wise: be sure you have your insurance paid up!

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
